Undergraduate Excellent Scholarships Announcement

1) Objective:

The WUIC Undergraduate Excellent Scholarships program aims to encourage the admission of students with excellent academic records and to motivate the scholarship recipients to make satisfactory academic progress towards the completion of their degree. The decisions of WUIC scholarship committee are final and not subject to further appeal.

2) Number and Amount of Scholarships:

Each year, WUIC provides up to 15 scholarships in total.

2.1 **Full Scholarships: Full tuition and educational support fees**

Each Full Scholarship, worth approximately US\$ 40,000 – US\$60,000 for 4 years, covers tuition, accommodation fees and monthly allowance.

2.2 **Full Tuition Fees Scholarships: Full tuition fees waiving, worth US\$14,000 –US\$35,000**

2.3 **Half Tuition Fees Scholarships: 50 % tuition fees waiving, worth US\$ 7,000 – US\$17,500**

The scholarship recipients must maintain their academic record during the whole period of study. Otherwise the scholarships may be terminated.

3) Applicant's Qualifications:

- 3.1 Must have completed G12 or other high school equivalent certificates.
- 3.2 Minimum High School grade point average (GPA) of not less than the equivalent of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale
- 3.3 Must meet the minimum requirement on English competency equivalent to TOEFL IBT 61 or IELTS 6.0 or other equivalent standard scores.

4) Application Requirements:

- 4.1 The Student must apply to one of WUIC degree programs before applying for a scholarship. The application can be done online at <https://entry.wu.ac.th>
- 4.2 Letter of recommendation from the high school Director as in the form attached. The official contact detail of the reference must be specified.
- 4.3 Statement of purpose (within 1 page) on why the applicant is interested in the selected program and why applicant deserves the scholarship.
- 4.4 All submitted documents which are not written in English or Thai, must be translated into English.

5) Conditions to Maintain Granted Scholarships:

- 5.1 Recipients must make satisfactory academic progress toward completion of their degree. Recipients will be continuously granted scholarships for **8 regular semesters** if the recipients can maintain their GPA as stated.
- 5.2 Recipients who are first-year students shall nonetheless be granted the scholarships continually for a minimum period of one academic year even though the cumulative GPA achieved in the first semester appears to be less than 3.0 with **no "F", "U", and "W"** grades, otherwise the scholarships will be terminated.

Recipients who are 2nd year, 3rd year and 4th year students must maintain the **cumulative GPA** not less than **3.0** and must not get GPA less than **3.0 for two consecutive semesters**, otherwise the scholarships will be terminated.

- 5.3 Recipients must enroll in the courses as specified in the curriculum.
- 5.4 Recipients shall have an obligation to work for the **WUIC** for at least **2 hours per week** or **not less than 20 hours per semester**.

6) Breach of Scholarship:

- 6.1 Recipients' **resignation** or otherwise cessation from study at WUIC prior to graduation, other than as a result of death, shall be regarded as the recipient's breach of the scholarships in an amount **two times the aggregate amount** previously received from WUIC. In such case, the reimbursement to WUIC shall be made by the recipients within 60 days from the day the recipients cease to be students.

If the recipients fail to make payment to the College within such time limit, the College may charge interest.

- 6.2 In the event of the recipients' commission of such misconduct as to be punished for grave breach of the students' discipline, the College is entitled to annul the scholarship forthwith. In such case, the recipients shall be regarded as committing a breach of the scholarship agreement and shall, as a consequence thereof, make reimbursement to the College in accordance with the rules and rates hitherto set out in Clause 6.1 above.
